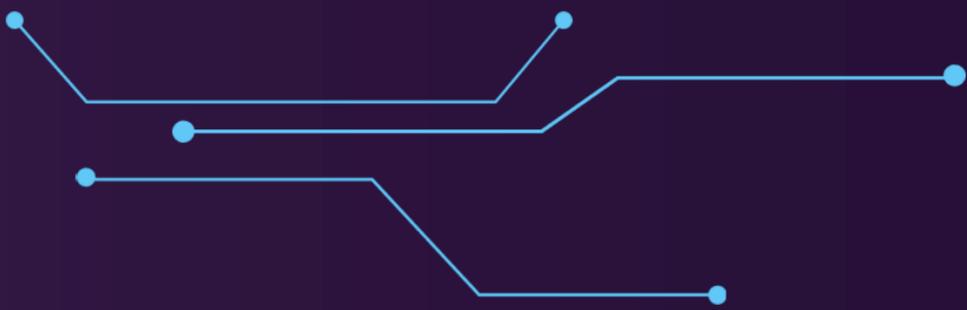


DOES FREE TO READ MEAN FREE TO TRAIN? THE OA-AI CONUNDRUM

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FROM SYSTEMS TO ETHICS

- **Legal ≠ ethical**
- **Choices, not inevitabilities**
- **Consequences for people**

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INTENT VS REALITY OF OPENNESS

- **OA designed for people**
- **Expectations vs outcomes**
- **Reuse in the service of research**
- **Ethical misalignment remains**

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ATTRIBUTION, TRUST, AND HARM

- **Attribution underpins scholarship**
- **AI breaks traceability**
- **Harm is uneven**

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VALUE WITHOUT RECIPROCITY

- **Scholarly labour is collective**
- **Value is extracted**
- **Recognition is lost**

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QUALITY, POWER, AND MANIPULATION

- **OA improves AI quality**
- **Restriction has risks**
- **Misinformation thrives in gaps**
