





"Open Scholarship is the practice of applying principles of openness to research processes and outputs, within an environment that is transparent and collaborative. Sharing research outputs such as literature, methods, data, code, and results, under terms that enable effective reproducibility and reuse, has broad benefits for research quality and impact. Practising Open Scholarship principles means planning for early and long-term access to research, thus enhancing and accelerating the benefits of research to society."

Open Scholarship is concerned with all the professional activities that researchers find themselves doing today – data stewardship, peer review, publication, workshops and conferences

Takes place at intersection between open and online <u>infrastructure and platforms</u>, and a set of <u>values</u>: of collaboration, cooperation and sharing.

OS strives to redefine how scholarly activity is recognised, recorded and assessed.
